All updates should be reported to each member's local county office online or by phone, email, fax or in-person.

Mandatory Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan (MCP)

Dual Eligible Enrollment Takes Effect As of January 1, 30 percent of people in California who were eligible for both Medicare and Medi-Cal, and weren't already enrolled, had to join a Medi-Cal managed care plan (MCP).

This mandated change does not affect access to Medicare providers or benefits. Plus, Medicare providers serving dual eligible patients do not need to enroll in a Medi-Cal MCP to continue receiving reimbursement. More than 70

DHCS published an updated fact sheet and toolkit for Medicare providers to explain the provider crossover billing process for dual eligible members enrolled in Medi-Cal managed care.
